



John McArthur FCIArb and Northern California Chapter Chair has written a new, scholarly book, *The Reasoned Arbitration Award in the United States: Its Promise, Problems, Preparation, and Preservation.* Receive a 10% discount on online orders by using the code NABCIARB. John's book explains his view that that "silent" awards are not less prone to challenge and not necessarily cheaper to prepare than reasoned awards, criticizes six ways awards often fail to give meaningful reasons, and argues that U.S. courts have improperly tended to uphold such awards as "reasoned." The work has John's extensive analysis of each ground of vacatur and its success rate based on his study of vacatur opinions in Westlaw for 2010–2017 with a link to appendices with synopses of the vacatur opinions for exceeding powers, manifest disregard, violating public policy, and evident partiality. It also has appendices for awards he treats as well reasoned and for those he views as not so. John spoke on awards at the NAB Members' Retreat in Santa Fe in April.

John W. Garman (Huntington Beach, CA; Vienna, Austria)

John's background and experience is in the areas of international commercial transactions and alternate dispute resolution. He is a Neutral on the American Arbitration Association Commercial Arbitration and Mediation Panel and has served as Panel Chair, Panel Member and Sole Arbitrator in various matters. John

currently teaches as a part time Professor at the University of Southern California, Gould Law School. John is "Of Counsel" to Hasch & Partners, an Austrian law firm and has offices in Vienna, Austria and Huntington Beach, California. He is admitted in California, the District of Columbia and as a Solicitor of the Supreme Court of England and Wales.



Grant L. Kim (San Francisco, CA)

Grant Kim FCIArb is a partner at LimNexus who has transitioned from advocate to arbitrator over the past 6 years. He previously served as counsel in numerous arbitrations while working for 30 years at top firms in San Francisco, Seoul, and Tokyo.
