New Arbitration Decision of Interest: In *Amberson v. McAllen*, the United States Court of Appeals for the Fifth Circuit recently addressed a challenge to a reasoned

arbitration award. The dispute arose after the losing party in the arbitration filed for bankruptcy protection, and the prevailing party then filed an objection in the Bankruptcy Court to the losing party's attempt to discharge the Award. The Bankruptcy Court granted summary judgment to the creditor on the preclusive effect of the Award and its satisfaction of all of the elements of 11 U.S.C. §523(a), and the District Court affirmed this ruling. On appeal, the Debtor challenged such preclusive effect on the basis that in issuing the award, the Arbitrator included a "disclaimer," *i.e.*, that he "disclaimed" that the Award constituted the entry of findings of fact and conclusions of law. The Debtor contended that this "disclaimer" allegedly deprived the prevailing party's reliance upon the Award because its lack of finality estopped the prevailing party from objecting to discharge. Rejecting this argument, and focusing upon the fact that the Arbitrator issued a 53-page, single-spaced, Award after conducting an almost 11-day hearing and considering 300 exhibits and testimony from 16 witnesses, the Court of Appeals held that the Award, standing alone, supported the discharge challenge. 

Ricardo A. Ampudia (Miami, FL)
